City: Ashland, Ohio is located approximately 60 miles south of Cleveland and 80 miles north of Columbus along I-71. A 2010 census estimated the population of Ashland City as 20,362. For residents, ages 25 and over, 89.3% earned a high school diploma. In addition, 25.9% of the residents ages 25 and over hold a bachelor's or higher level degree. The median income is \$37,776.00. The unemployment rate was 4.6% as of March 2018.

District (IRN #043505): Ashland City School District is comprised of two elementary schools, one intermediate school, one middle school, and one high school. Ashland City Schools is employing the Ohio Improvement Process as a framework to analyze data, set goals, and execute aligned action steps at the building and district levels for student improvement. We have set the following goals: Leadership, Access to Grade Level & Beyond, Reading, and Mathematics.
