Board Adopted Quarantine Protocols

Effective September 16th, 2021

Student is positive to COVID-19 antigen test**

- Isolation for 10 days
- -Student returns to school on the 11th day, symptom and fever free

Once a
student tests
negative to a
COVID-19
antigen test,
the student
can be
released
from
quarantine

- Students who are exhibiting symptoms of illness are quarantined (isolated) until recovered from symptoms or are fever-free or have a negative COVID-19 antigen test.
- Students who are positive to a COVID-19 antigen test are quarantined (isolated) for ten (10) days or once they test negative to a COVID-19 antigen test the student can be released from quarantine.
- If a student has close contact with a person at school
 who has tested positive for COVID-19, the administration
 will contact the student's parent/caregiver to inform them
 the student was in close contact with a positive person.
 In accordance with CDC guidelines, the parent/caregiver
 should consider the close contact student be tested with
 a COVID-19 antigen test after 48 hours. If the student
 tests positive, they will quarantine per the above
 procedures. Parents/caregivers should continue to
 monitor the close contact student for symptoms of
 COVID-19.
- Close contacts are not quarantined and are eligible to participate in all school activities.Parents/caregivers should continue to monitor the close contact student for symptoms of COVID-19.
- If a close contact student does quarantine voluntarily, they will not face penalties if work is made up.

Notified by administration and informed of CDC recommendation to be COVID-19 antigen tested after 48 hours

No quarantine required unless test is taken and is positive



^{*}A close contact person is any person exposed to an individual that tested positive for COVID-19.

^{**}The person who tested positive for COVID-19 should follow standard isolation procedures.
